West ruffed and.....

.....laid down DA. DK did not fall

NS made 4 Tricks (1 in each Suit), declarer went down 1

West forgot the Bidding

South bid 1NT, so must have almost all the missing Points and must have 2 Diamonds

So, West should cross to HA and finesse the DK through South. Contract made!

[As an aside, North should bid 4H or 4S, not Double. South can make this, again remembering the Bidding. West should have 7+ Diamonds for the repeat Diamond Bids. That means West is likely short in Spades. Draw Trumps (if in 4H), then deal with the Spades. Play SK, noting SQ falls, and finesse SJ9 through East, losing just 2 Clubs and HA]

MORAL OF THE STORY

Don't forget the Bidding! This is so easy to do, as you concentrate on the best way to make based on the Cards before your eyes
