You bid 6NT

## Lead: DQ

Dummy goes down

You see at once that 6H makes easily

What about 6NT?

You look at Dummy. It will all turn on the Clubs breaking 3-3 or C10 falling Singleton or Doubleton (all up, about 50%). Or you could finesse C10 through your Hand, hoping South has it (about 50%)

Another line is to run all your Hearts first, hoping NS throw enough Clubs (take care with entries whilst doing this)

## **MORAL OF THE STORY**

Getting the right Contract is often a guess. Probably, bidding 6H here is correct

But 6NT also has its merits
