CODE OF CONDUCT

It is a requirement of the Constitution of the Canberra Bridge Club Inc (the Club) that members:

- support the Association's objects; and
- comply with the Associations Incorporation Act 1991 and the Club's Constitution, Codes and bylaws.

This means that members are required to behave in a manner consistent with the Club's Code of Conduct. The purpose of this document is to set out standards and desirable behaviours for members of the Canberra Bridge Club.

As a member of the of the Canberra Bridge Club, members agree that they will:

- Assist the Club develop and maintain a friendly, harmonious, and sociable culture by treating all people associated with the Club, including other members and staff, with respect and courtesy.
- 2. Respect members' rights to express opinions and seek clarifications from the Director.
- 3. To the best of their abilities, consistently comply with the Laws of Duplicate Bridge 2017 as amended (the Laws).
- 4. Comply with Law 74 Conduct and Etiquette.
- 5. Behave ethically and act with competitive integrity. This includes refraining from:
 - a. Bullying. harassing, arguing with or berating partners or opponents
 - b. Discussing the bidding, play or result of a board, which may be overheard at another table.
 - c. Making gratuitous comments during the auction and play.
 - d. Using facial or oral expressions, hand gestures or comments as guidance to partner play.
 - e. Making psychic¹ bids against inexperienced players.
 - f. Using psychic bids which have the potential to lead to implicit understanding between partners (which is illegal under the Laws).
 - g. Discourteous communication with the Director
 - h. Making unwelcome sexual conduct or request for sexual favours
 - i. Socially inappropriate physical contact with players.

Note: A member's behaviour may be considered misconduct or unethical conduct under the Club's bylaws in cases where it is established there is a pattern of behavior including consistent refusal or failure to comply with the Laws of Duplicate Bridge.

- 6. Have the best interests of the Club and its members in mind at all times.
- 7. Comply with the requirements of the Constitution and bylaws of the Club, for example, the requirements of the Dress Code.
- 8. Where possible and practicable, actively participate in Canberra Bridge Club social and volunteer activities.

¹¹ A psychic bid is deliberately deceiving opponents by grossly misstating the power and/or suit lengths of one's hand.
Whilst legal under the Laws a psychic bid should only be used when playing against players of equal of higher standard.
Making a psychic bid against inexperienced players is regarded as extreme bad sportsmanship.
