THE BIDDING AT OUR TABLE

| West | North | East | South |
| :--- | :--- | :--- | :--- |
| 1D | $1 N T$ | $3 D(1)$ | $3 H(2)$ |
| $P$ | $P(3)$ | $P$ |  |

(1) A silly bid - see (2) below
(2) South should double -3 Dx goes down $3=800$. But he bid 3 H
(3) I decided to Pass - given both East and West had bid, I did not think we would make 4H

## CONTRACT

3H by South
THE PLAY
West led AKQ of Spades, and later East made HJ = 9 Tricks
We scored $100 \%$, as at other tables 4 H was bid and went down

## OTHER TABLES

I noticed at all other Tables 4H was played by North, with East leading a Diamond (partner's bid suit) or a Club (no Easts led a Spade)

How do you make 10 Tricks?
You count your tricks
4 Hearts, 4 Clubs and AK of Diamonds $=10$
As this was on Bridge Base, I looked up and saw where it went wrong
Declarers invariably drew AK of Hearts and then drew the Third Trump. East got in and switched to a Spade. West took 3 Spades, Contract down

## COMMENT

You should win the lead, play AK of Hearts, then play AKQ of Clubs (hoping the Defender with the last Heart has at least 3 Clubs (phew, it works here!). Then cross to the North Hand with a Diamond, and play CJ throwing a losing Spade

East can Trump CJ if he wishes, or wait, but all you lose is 2 Spades and 1 Heart

## MORAL OF THE STORY

Count your Tricks early. Look at ways to make your Contract. Don't draw the last Trump if the Defenders will win it anyway (and especially if you are heavily exposed in a suit - Spades here)

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
