## THE BIDDING

North - South have bid to 6S, and West leads HK. Plan the play

First, count your winners - there are only $8(4 \mathrm{~S}, 1 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{D}$ and 2 C ), so you have some work to do to make 4 extra Tricks

1 Trick will come by ruffing a Club in the North Hand
So, you will need 3 more. Diamonds is the only realistic chance (not Clubs, unless you are really lucky and one hand has CQ and CJ bare, very unlikely - about 5\%)

You draw Trumps, they break 3-2 (phew!)

Then you visualise how the Diamonds may break. You are missing KJ1072

You will succeed if Diamonds break as follows:

| K | J1072 | (K with West) |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| $K x$ | $x x x$ | (Kx with West) |
| Kxx | $J 10$ | (Either way) |

## What should you do?

After Trumps are drawn, play DA, then lead low towards DQ. You will succeed if any of the above occur (which is about 65\%)

MORAL OF THE STORY

Count your winners, then find a way to make your contract

Visualise where the missing cards may be, in the necessary suit (Diamonds)
Then play DA and lead up to DQ. You make your contract

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
