- (1) 18-19 balanced, denies 3-card Spade support
- (2) Blackwood
- (3) 2 Aces
- (4) King Ask
- (5) 3 Kings
- (6) North knows they have all the Aces and Kings, so bids 7S (!)

THE PLAY

East led HQ

The Contract is doomed – eventually, West will make SQ, or East will make HQ or CQ

To make Grand Slam (which is very rare), you need to have a bit more with North – add in SQ and it is much more likely to make

COMMENT

The safest and best Contract here is 6NT. Provided South plays on Spades immediately, South will make 4 Spades, 2 Hearts, 5 Diamonds and 2 Clubs = 12 Tricks

MORAL OF THE STORY

Any 7 - level contract is risky, as any simple gap in the cards can take it down (Queens, Jacks and even 10s are paramount, or a long suit to run)

Usually, if you bid and make a 6 - level contract, you will score very well
